On Thursday 19 and Friday 20 May I had opportunity to visit Adelaide with members of the APF Federal and WA Branch at the invitation of the South Australian School Leaders Association (SASSLA). At a meeting between the SASSLA Board and APF executives, we engaged in discourse relating to state-based issues as well as deliberating upon areas of common interest for future collaborative engagement. It was clear from chatting with our interstate colleagues that there is a commonality of issues and challenges faced by our school leaders across our respective states.

The SASSLA 2022 conference presented the latest evidence on leader workload and explored why there is a compelling case to re-evaluate the working conditions of leaders. Attendance at the conference afforded time to engage with SA school leaders as well as partake in the keynote address presented by Professor Phil Riley.

Many of you will be aware of Professor Riley's work and research that has been undertaken for many years in the area of school leaders' health and well-being. Phil O'Loughlin, SASSLA CEO, delivered a session that addressed the complexity of the role of a school leader, and the pressures upon the role which make it almost undoable. The messaging from both presenters was that more needed to be done by the employer in recognition of the role, and to support school leaders to create the conditions in which their staff, students and broader school community thrive.



"We have to get the message across to Ministers that school leaders are the key to raising the status of teaching. It is the school leader who sets the conditions in their school where staff and students thrive. School leaders need to be trusted more to do this and resourced better to enable it to occur. When that happens teachers are more connected, and students more engaged, and schools are great places to be as hubs of their community...."

APF PD – Thriving and Surviving in Challenging Times

Thank you to all who attended the PD last Friday. We are well aware that current staffing challenges precluded many from attending however those who managed to come, were afforded an engaging and thought provoking presentation by our keynote speaker Maria Ruberto and special presentation by Dale Sidebottom.



Maria highlighted the importance of brain fitness and immersed us with the latest neuroscience research relating to mind health. Of particularly note was her sharing of the latest research relating to relational resilience that comes from '*flocking*.' We are well aware of the 4 F's relating to trauma response (Fight, Flight or Freeze and Fawn) however a 5th F has been introduced termed Flocking. The term is derived from the flocking behaviour exhibited when a group of birds (a flock) are foraging or travelling collectively. Never before has

the need to 'flock' with others become so pertinent and relevant. The pandemic has seen us disconnect in many ways, and the message Maria gave us highlighted the need to reconnect and collaborate with colleagues. The challenge is to find your flock as collectively you can group together in facing challenges and offering support.

Complementing Maria's presentation was a special address by Dale Sidebottom titled *All Work No Play*. Dale is the creator and founder of Jugar Life, a business platform that provides people with the tools to make play a focus of their everyday. 

Inauguration of Ballarat's First Peace Pole at Sebastopol Primary School

This is a report of a well attended event that took place on 18th March this year.

We paused to reflect on peace with the children who are our future. Sebastopol Primary School students and staff members celebrated the installation and inauguration of Ballarat's first Peace Pole with representatives of Federal and State parliament, Ballarat Council, Indigenous Leaders, Compassionate Ballarat, Let's Talk Peace Ballarat, Rotary International, Ballarat Interfaith Network, and other community members as part of Harmony Fest.

"A Peace Pole is an internationally-recognized symbol of the hopes and dreams of the entire human family, standing vigil in silent prayer for peace on earth. Each Peace Pole bears the message May Peace Prevail on Earth in different languages on each of its four sides. There are estimated over 250,000 Peace Poles in every country in the world dedicated as monuments to peace."

"Planting a Peace Pole is a way of bringing people together to inspire, awaken and uplift the human consciousness the world over. Peace Poles are now recognized as the most prominent international symbol and monument to peace. They remind us to think, speak and act in the spirit of peace and harmony. Stand as a silent visual for peace to prevail on earth." (Proof of vaccination will be required of all ceremony guests.)

THE NEW LIBRARY

Libraries have to stay relevant as budgets are slashed and e-books are on the rise. One library offers free access to 3-D printers, laser cutters and milling machines. Another offers musical instruments for checkout. Along with their new offerings, libraries are presenting a more open face to the outside world, using lots of glass, providing comfortable seating as much for collaborative work as solitary pursuits, and allowing food and drink. Being inviting isn't just to boost attendance but to maximise people's creativity. Libraries have long facilitated the finding of information; now they are facilitating the creating of information. One library has a new section called Teen Central - known as "homago", a space where teenagers can "hang out, mess around and geek out". It will include lounges, restaurant booths, game rooms and digital labs, as well as software and equipment to record music and create comic books. In the old library, you would ask a question and the librarian would find an answer. Today it's the opposite. People turn to librarians to help them sift through the millions of answers they find on the Internet. Librarians have become navigators. One library has done away with books altogether and now has rows of computers, ereaders and an 'iPad bar'. Its goal is the same as that of traditional libraries: to help patrons access

Role of the APF — Industrial Relations: 101

At the APF consistent with industrial relations '101' we are concerned with matters such as your salaries, classification, entitlements, protections, contracts of employment and amongst other matters, the manner in which you are assessed and the consequences thereof.

Further, your access to industrial and/or legal advice, advocacy and support in relation to matters of discipline, conflict resolution, conflict of interest, complaints and/or performance.

Role of the APF — Industrial Relations: 102

Industrial matters arising from the management and implementation of one's professional role. Specifically as a function of Principal Class Employee interpreting and performing their accountabilities and obligations as defined by contract of employment; the operation of industrial agreements, Ministerial Orders and the changing compliance environment determined by legislation, regulations and policy.
