This term has traditionally seen an escalation in respiratory illness, and combined with the ongoing (and what seems to be never ending) Covid pandemic, schools continue to face challenges and ongoing demands particularly in relation to workforce shortages. It is without doubt that these are difficult times with challenges aplenty and it appears that the recent advice

in relation to wearing masks has caused upset for some.

There will always be public opinion on the do's and don'ts on how to manage the pandemic and the associated key safety measures. Schools as public places, have an obligation to mitigate the risks with community members having a personal obligation for their health and wellbeing in addition to a communal responsibility. Whilst the request to wear a mask indoors is simply a recommendation and not a mandate, it is for the betterment of all and like all things in life, not everyone will adhere to the request. The mask wearing recommendation should not present as an item of debate for school leaders. If people wish to challenge the recommendation, remind them that as required, you are following the government's stated advice and implementing the employer's policies. Interestingly, some principals have reported a greater uptake of mask wearing recently as a result of the request as opposed to when masks were mandated.

The Minister of Education is holding a Roundtable with peak bodies to discuss measures and strategies that need to be adjusted or implemented in order to combat the adverse impact of the pandemic through the remainder of this year. I have consulted with APF State Council on this and welcome direct feedback from members in order to present your perspective at the Roundtable.



The term has also brought changes at the ministerial level and we welcome Ms Natalie Hutchins as Minister for Education and Minister for Women. The APF looks forward to working with Minister Hutchins for the benefit and furtherance of our education system and in particular our school leaders.

I would like to take opportunity to thank former Deputy Premier and Minister for Education, James Merlino for his service

and commitment to education over an extended period of time. During his stewardship as Minister, Mr Merlino inspired and delivered immense reforms through the Education State agenda. We extend our gratitude for his dedication to build a world class education system across Victoria and wish him the very best in his future endeavours.

School Community Safety Scheme

The Department of Education and Training has strengthened the legal protections available to all Victorian schools in response to unacceptable behaviour from parents, carers and other adults in the school community by introducing the School Community Safety Order Scheme.

Established under the <u>Education and Training Reform Amendment (Protection of School</u> <u>Communities) Act 2021</u>, the Scheme provides new measures and actions when inappropriate behaviour is levelled towards people in our school community.

The Scheme empowers authorised persons, including principals, to issue School Community Safety Orders to prohibit or limit unacceptable or unreasonable behaviour. These orders are a last resort option where they are the least restrictive option available to deal with the behaviour. You can watch a short video providing an overview of the Scheme here.

Respectful Behaviours within the School Community Policy

The Scheme is just one part of the Department's initiatives to address work-related violence in schools. The Department's <u>Respectful Behaviours within the School Community Policy</u> on the new <u>Creating safer school communities page</u> of the Department's website communicates the shared responsibility staff, parents and other adults have in behaving respectfully.

We encourage you to familiarise yourself with the <u>policy</u> to understand what constitutes unacceptable or unreasonable behaviours and set expectations of respectful behaviour within your school community.
